# MINOR IN ENTREPRENEURSHIP

## Program Learning Outcomes for the Minor in Entrepreneurship

Upon completing the minor in Entrepreneurship, students will be able to:

- 1. Execute the steps of the entrepreneurial process.
- 2. Demonstrate knowledge of the entrepreneurial mindset.
- 3. Communicate effectively the value of an entrepreneurial venture.

## Requirements for the Minor in Entrepreneurship

Students pursuing the minor in Entrepreneurship must complete:

- A minimum of 6 courses (18 credit hours) to satisfy minor requirements.
- A minimum of 2 courses (6 credit hours) taken at the 300-level or above.
- A maximum of 2 courses (6 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit. For additional program guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the Policies (p. 1) tab.

The courses listed below satisfy the requirements for this minor. In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the minor's academic advisor or, where applicable, the Program Director. (Course substitutions must be formally applied and entered into Degree Works by the minor's <a href="Official Certifier">Official Certifier</a> (<a href="https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/">Officialcertifier/</a>)). Students and their academic advisors should identify and clearly document the courses to be taken.

## Policies for the Minor in Entrepreneurship Declaration of the Entrepreneurship Minor

To declare the minor in Entrepreneurship, students must bring a completed declaration form and unofficial transcript to the program director for review and signature. The *Declaration and Change of Minor Form* is available on ESTHER (https://esther.rice.edu/).

## **Program Restrictions and Exclusions**

Students pursuing the minor in Entrepreneurship should be aware of the following program restriction:

 As noted in Majors, Minors, and Certificates (https://ga.rice.edu/ undergraduate-students/academic-opportunities/majors-minorscertificates/), i.) students may declare their intent to pursue a minor only after they have first declared a major, and ii.) students may not major and minor in the same subject.

#### **Transfer Credit**

Some departments and programs have additional restrictions on transfer credit. Requests for transfer credit must be approved for Rice equivalency by the designated transfer credit advisor for the appropriate academic department offering the Rice equivalent course (corresponding to the subject code of the course content). Students are encouraged to meet with the applicable transfer credit advisor as well as their academic program director when considering transfer credit possibilities.

## **Program Transfer Credit Guidelines**

Students pursuing the minor in Entrepreneurship should be aware of the following program-specific transfer credit guideline:

 No more than 2 courses (6 credit hours) of transfer credit from U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards the minor.
