

MASTER OF FINE ARTS (MFA) DEGREE IN THE FIELD OF CREATIVE WRITING

Program Learning Outcomes for the MFA Degree

Upon completing the MFA degree, students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate the ability to integrate creative research into artistic production across genres and media, contributing to innovation in contemporary literature.
2. Demonstrate the ability to develop and implement writing projects that engage with diverse communities, addressing real-world issues and fostering collaboration.
3. Demonstrate a global and cross-cultural writing practice by studying, translating, and engaging with literary traditions beyond the Anglophone world.
4. Develop and demonstrate their personalized approach to teaching creative writing that can respond to diverse learning environments, whether in university classrooms, community settings, or public workshops

Requirements for the MFA Degree

The MFA degree in the field of Creative Writing is a thesis master's degree. Students pursuing the MFA degree in the field of Creative Writing must complete:

- A minimum of 18 courses (54 credit hours) to satisfy degree requirements.
- A minimum of 54 credit hours of graduate-level study (graduate semester credit hours, coursework at the 500-level or above).
- A minimum of 48 graduate semester credit hours must be taken at Rice University.
- A minimum residency enrollment of three fall or spring semesters of full-time graduate study at Rice University.
- A maximum of 2 courses (6 graduate semester credit hours) from transfer credit. For additional departmental guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the [Policies](#) (p. 2) tab.
- A minimum overall GPA of 2.67 or higher in all Rice coursework.
- A minimum program GPA of 2.67 or higher in all Rice coursework that satisfies requirements for the thesis master's degree.

The courses listed below satisfy the requirements for this degree program. In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the program's academic advisor or, where applicable, the department or program's Director of Graduate Studies. Course substitutions must be formally applied and entered into Degree Works by the department or program's [Official Certifier](https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/) (<https://registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/>). Additionally, these course substitutions must be approved by the Office of Graduate

and Postdoctoral Studies. Students and their academic advisors should identify and clearly document the courses to be taken.

Students are encouraged to meet with their academic program's advisor when considering transfer credit possibilities.

Departmental Transfer Credit Guidelines

- Students pursuing the MFA degree should be aware of the following departmental transfer credit guidelines:
- No more than 2 courses (6 credit hours) of credit from another U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards the degree.
 - Transfer courses must be comparable in content and depth to the corresponding course at Rice and must not have counted toward another degree.
