- 2. Demonstrate the ability to define and respond to research questions and scholarly debates within the field, including the ability to analyze primary and secondary sources, draw conclusions from the analysis of these sources, and cite evidence in support of conclusions

# **Requirements for the Minor in Medieval** and Early Modern Studies

Students pursuing the minor in Medieval and Early Modern Studies must complete:

- · A minimum of 6 courses (18 credit hours) to satisfy minor requirements.
- · A minimum of 3 courses (9 credit hours) taken at the 300-level or above.
- · A maximum of 2 courses (6 credit hours) from study abroad or transfer credit. For additional departmental guidelines regarding transfer credit, see the Policies (p. 4) tab.

The courses listed below satisfy the requirements for this minor. In certain instances, courses not on this official list may be substituted upon approval of the minor's academic advisor or, where applicable, the Program Director. (Course substitutions must be formally applied and entered into Degree Works by the minor's Official Certifier (https:// registrar.rice.edu/facstaff/degreeworks/officialcertifier/)). Students and their academic advisors should identify and clearly document the courses to be taken.

# **Program Restrictions and Exclusions**

Students pursuing the minor in Medieval and Early Modern Studies should be aware of the following program restriction:

 As noted in Majors, Minors, and Certificates (https://ga.rice.edu/ undergraduate-students/academic-opportunities/majors-minorscertificates/), i.) students may declare their intent to pursue a minor only after they have first declared a major, and ii.) students may not major and minor in the same subject.

## **Transfer Credit**

Some departments and programs have additional restrictions on transfer credit. ## **Program Transfer Credit Guidelines**

Students pursuing the minor in Medieval and Early Modern Studies should be aware of the following program-specific transfer credit quideline:

 No more than 2 courses (6 credit hours) of transfer credit from U.S. or international universities of similar standing as Rice may apply towards the minor.

Faculty and leadership in the academic schools are responsible for ensuring that the courses identified as distribution-credit-eligible meet the criteria as set in the <u>General Announcements</u> (<a href="https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/#text">https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduation-requirements/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/#text</a>). Students are responsible for ensuring that they meet graduation requirements (<a href="https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/#text">https://ga.rice.edu/undergraduate-students/academic-policies-procedures/graduation-requirements/#text</a>) by completing coursework designated as distribution-credit-eligible at the time of course registration.
